### Notes about "The Breadth of Blossoms"

This piece was commissioned by Voices of Concinnity Chamber Ensemble. Wanting to create a true collaborative process for the singers during a time when singing together was no longer the "norm", Cheryl held a zoom meeting to discuss the impact of COVID19 on the choir.

A large variety of emotions, circumstances, and responses surrounding COVID-19 was revealed. And, however different the singers' experiences, there was common ground in the belief that there was more space to notice spring than ever before.

The piece was written specifically for a virtual experience. Rather than have all the singers sing alone, to a midi or guide track, Liz (soprano 1) sang her part then sent her recording to Cheryl, who sent it to the next singer, who sent his part back to Cheryl. Those two parts were combined and sent to the third singer, and so on. Each singer was able to sing "with" their choirmates.

In the collaborative process, Cheryl was able to poll the choir to see what words were important to them, what ranges they most wanted to sing, and, if anyone wanted to perform an improvisation. The text "Restore, reset after pushing through the frozen ground" was developed from a comment made by bass Jermaine Woodard, Jr. on that initial zoom call, who, on the original recording (found at <a href="https://www.cbemusic.co/breadth">www.cbemusic.co/breadth</a>) sang the improvised solo.


